GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD

One of the blessings for which we thank God are the many people who are willing workers at Good Steward. At our last meeting three board members were reelected to three-year terms. We thank them for their willingness to serve on the board and for the other work which they do for Good Steward. If you have questions or suggestions for our store, please do not hesitate to talk to one of them.

We also thank God for our Store Manager, Jeff Essig, and the eight coordinators who work with him. They are hardworking and a great blessing to our store. And we thank God for the more than 200 volunteers who work at Good Steward. Without them we would not be able to provide the amount of help that we do give to Luther High School and area Lutheran elementary schools. More volunteers are welcome at any time.

GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD (2)

The financial report for 2024 shows us that God continues to pour out His blessings on our store. Total sales for last year were \$886,543, which is slightly more than a 10% increase over 2023. Because of God's grace and mercy, we were able to contribute \$295,500 to Luther High School. We were also able to give \$99,500 to Lutheran elementary schools. And we donated \$19,200 to various charitable organizations. We thank God for enabling us to do this work. And we pray that He will continue to bless us in the year which lies before us.

LOOKING AHEAD

Each year volunteers at Luther High School host an Appreciation Dinner for volunteers at Good Steward. This year's extravagan a is scheduled for Monday, April 28. Because our hosts do need to know how much food to prepare, we ask that those who plan to attend sign up for this dinner. The sign-up sheet will be found at the Good Steward Resale Shop.

Another date to remember is May 31. Volunteers who work at Good Steward for a minimum number of hours each year are given the privilege of nominating students at Luther or an area elementary school for a Good Steward grant. In addition to the merchandise which is at Good Steward, we do have a warehouse, which contains 8,686 boxes of additional merchandise. At the present time, we are looking for another warehouse or a piece of property on which we might build a new warehouse.
