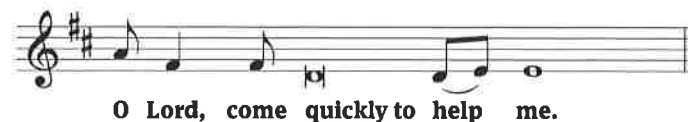
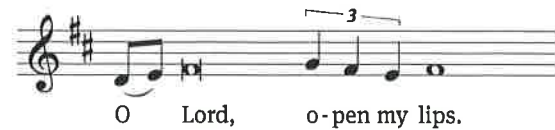

Jeremiah 26:8–15

⁸But as soon as Jeremiah finished telling all the people everything the LORD had commanded him to say, the priests, the prophets and all the people seized him and said, "You must die! ⁹Why do you prophesy in the LORD's name that this house will be like Shiloh and this city will be desolate and deserted?" And all the people crowded around Jeremiah in the house of the LORD.

¹⁰When the officials of Judah heard about these things, they went up from the royal palace to the house of the LORD and took their places at the entrance of the New Gate of the LORD's house. "Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and all the people, "This man should be sentenced to death because he has prophesied against this city. Prayer for Grace

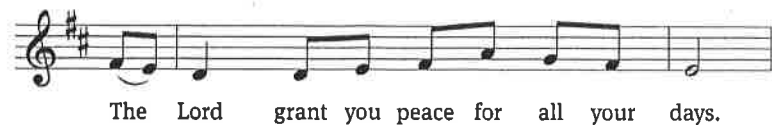
O Lord, our heavenly Father, almighty and everlasting God, you have
